The Seldén 420 British National Championships 2024 - Dale

The Organising Authority is Celtic Sea Watersports in conjunction with Dale Yacht Club and the British International 420 class (UK)

The Class is very aware that we have new sailors to the Class attending this event who won't have been through equipment inspection before. The intention of inspection is not to 'catch people out', but to ensure fair sailing and to also educate sailors so they are prepared for international events in the future. 1. General

- 1.1. All boats and equipment entered for The Seldén 420 British National Championships 2024 shall comply with the relevant rules including Class Rules, Notice of Race (NOR), Sailing Instructions (SI) and Equipment Inspection Regulations (EIR), defined collectively as the Event Equipment Rules.
- 1.2. Each boat is required to comply with the Event Equipment Rules from registration onwards, unless otherwise approved by the Technical Committee (TC). In accordance with RRS 78.1, competitors are responsible for ensuring that their boat is maintained in accordance with the Class Rules and that the measurement certificate remains valid. Any non-compliance may be protested and penalised as if the breach of a rule was discovered during or after racing. This changes RRS 78.1.
- 1.3. **Competitors shall present or verify the existence of a valid Hull Measurement Certificate if requested by an equipment inspector during the event. Valid digital copies will be accepted.**
 - 1.3.1. **For entries from GB - RYA Measurement Certificate AND the ISAF/World Sailing Certificate**
 - 1.3.2. **For International entries - ISAF/World Sailing Certificate only**

2. Equipment Inspection – Pre event

2.1. Equipment inspection will take place in the Dale boat park on the 22th of August. This will not be conducted to a schedule and any boat not inspected by the TC prior to D Flag being displayed will be inspected later during the event.

2.2. The equipment being inspected during the pre-event inspection includes:

- 2.2.1. The presence and correct number of corrector weights**
- 2.2.2. The presence of a towing rope as per Class Rule C.5.2.(b)(1)**
- 2.2.3. The correct number and type of block in the kicking strap. Class Rule F.6.2.(a)(9)**

3. Equipment Inspection – During the event

3.1. During the event, boats will be inspected at random to check they are using sails that display their submitted International 420 Class Association Sail Sticker numbers – aka Button Numbers

3.2. Boats may be spot checked for continued compliance with the areas covered in EIR 2.2

4. Standard Penalties

4.1. If a breach of the items outlined in sections 1, 2 or 3 above is identified, the TC shall verbally notify the concerned competitor(s) as soon as reasonably possible and when practical. The TC shall impose a penalty as per EIR 4.2 & 4.3

4.2. Standard penalties shall be applied as follows. The term “listed” refers to the inspection items described in Section 2.2 and Section 3 above; the term “not listed” refers to any infringement not in the list described in these sections.

4.4. The penalties in EIR 4.3 are calculated as follows:

$$\text{Penalty 1} = (\text{TotClass} - \text{ComPos}) \times 0.25$$

$$\text{Penalty 2} = (\text{TotClass} - \text{ComPos}) \times 0.5$$

Penalty 3 = TotClass – ComPos

Where, TotClass = The number of boats entered in the series. ComPos = The boat's overall series position at the end of the days racing before any penalties.

4.5. The points calculated in the penalties above shall be added to a boat's series score.
